**RESOLUTION NO. 230**

**Resolution of the City Council of the City of Parker adopting the September 2001 City of Parker Comprehensive Plan as the Official Comprehensive Plan of the City of Parker, Armstrong County, PA.**

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the City Council of the City of Parker, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, to provide for the planned and orderly development of the City, to regulate the use of land within the City, to plan for the movement of people and goods throughout the City, to plan for community services and utilities, and to coordinate the City's existing and proposed development with the existing and proposed development of contiguous municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the PA Municipalities Planning Code, the Planning Committee of the City of Parker has prepared a Comprehensive Plan for the City of Parker, PA, dated September 2001 (hereinafter referred to as "the Plan") that addresses the existing and future land use, housing, transportation, community facilities and other development needs of the City and the coordination of the City's development with contiguous municipalities and Armstrong County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Committee of the City of Parker has recommended that the City Council of the City of Parker approve and adopt the Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Parker held a public hearing on October 15, 2001 to solicit and consider public comment on the Plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Parker, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania as follows:

1. That the City Council of the City of Parker hereby adopts the Plan dated September 2001, which consists of text, charts, and maps, as the official Comprehensive Plan for the City of Parker, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania.
